INTRODUCTION

The Okanagan-Similkameen is an exceptional place, known for its spectacular landscapes, iconic wildlife, amazing outdoor opportunities, world class wines and diverse agricultural products. The region is also home to some of the greatest concentrations of species diversity and species at risk in Canada and is recognized as one of Canada's most endangered natural systems.

We work in partnership with landowners and communities to develop win-win solutions that benefit both land users and wildlife.

- We increase the # of acres that are enhanced while under stewardship






We improve our overall organizational capacity.
